- 1. The perfect tense is one of the two simple forms of the verb in Arabic and basically narrative in function. In most cases, it denotes a completed event or action.
- 2. The Arabic perfect tense corresponds to both the English past tense and present perfect:

کتَبَ: He wrote. He has written.

ذَهَب: He went. He has gone. ⊕ ImamSadiq.tv

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- A) The vowel *a* (*Fatha*) invariably follows R_1 and R_3 in the perfect tense.
- B) R₂ is mostly followed by a (Fatha): نَعَبَ (to write), ذَهَبَ (to go), نُعَلَ (to do), often by i (Kasra): شَرِبَ (to drink),
- c) سَمِعَ (sth was good), كَبُرَ (sth was good), كَبُرَ (sth was good), المَعِعَ became big).

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
