*Idāfa* is mostly used to indicate possession or belonging and basically entails putting one noun after another and the second noun specifies more precisely the nature of the first noun. In forms of Arabic which mark grammatical case, this second noun must be in the genitive case. The construction is typically equivalent to the English construction "(noun) of (noun)".
