Pronoun is a type of word that stands in the place of a noun. Sometimes, the subject of a verb is apparent (ظاهر) and no pronoun is needed. When the subject is unwritten, the suject is called 'مُضْمَرَ (concealed).

A chart indicating the pronouns of the subject for each of the fourteen seeghah is as follows:
