The Literal and the Figurative

- ✓ The usage of an expression or word in the total meaning of its subject is termed Hageegi (Literal); e.g. "I saw the sun", intending its entire disc.
- Usage of an expression in other than its subject is called Majazi (figurative);
 e.g."I saw a lion" intending a brave man.

Majazi (figurative) is of three types:

1) Intending a part of the meaning; e.g. I saw the sun in eclipse.

2) Intending an outside (related) meaning; e.g. the sun came into my room, intending its light.

 Intending something else (resembling); e.g. I saw a lion in command, intending a brave man.

Manqul (transferred)

Sometimes a word is excessively used for a figurative meaning in a way that that meaning and not the literal meaning is understood from the word. In this case the word is called *mangul* (transferred); such as the word 'salah'.
