Lesson 10

Idgham means the merging of a letter carrying a Sukoon into the following letter which carries a vowel as such that they become one and the second letter will be pronounced with Shaddah.

The rules for Idghaam are applied when:

1. Two identical letters follow each other, the first carrying a Sukoon, the second carrying a vowel e.g. قَدْ دَخَلُوا is read as

2. The first letter is (ب) carrying a Sukoon, followed by (م) carrying a vowel e.g. اركَبْ مَعَنا is read as

3. Any one of (ط د ت) carrying a Sukoon, followed by any one of the same three letters carrying a vowel e.g. For (ط د تُتَبَيَّنَ (د ت) is read as

4. Any one of the (ظ ذ ٹ) carrying a Sukoon, followed by any one the same three letters carrying a vowel e.g. For إذْ ظَلَمُوا (ذ ظ) is read as إظلَمُوا

5. (ف) carrying a Sukoon, followed by (ک) carrying a vowel

أَلَمْ نَخْلَكُم is read as أَلَم نَخْلُقُكُم e.g.

6. (\cup) carrying a Sukoon, followed by (\cup) carrying a vowel

قُرَّبِّی is read as قُلْ رَبِّی :eg

7. Carrying a Sukoon, followed by any of the letters (ي ر م ل و ن) carrying a vowel. For easy remembering letters of 'Yarmalun' (يرملون)
