Lesson 13

The pronoun Haa (هـ) is the letter (هـ) that comes at the end of the word and takes the place of the name.

The pronoun (هـ) never carries a fat-ha, it always carries either a Kasra or a Dhamma. But sometimes the short vowel of the pronoun (هـ) is pronounced as a long vowel (with Ishbaa') (الشباع) and sometimes it is pronounced normally as a short vowel (without Ishbaa')

Pronoun Haa pronounced with Ishbaa'

The short vowel of the pronoun Haa (-) is pronounced as a long vowel when both sides of the letter(-) are carrying a short vowel. If carrying a Dhamma it will be pronounced as the long vowel() and if carrying a Kasra it will be pronounced as a long vowel of (ي). e.g. إِنَّهُ لَقَوْلُ = إِنَّهُ لَقَوْلُ

Pronoun Haa is pronounced without "Ishbaa" in all other cases, which are;

- 1- One side or both sides of the pronoun (-) is accompanied by Sukoon.
- 2- The pronoun (4-) is followed by a letter accompanied by Shaddah.
- 3- The pronoun (-) is preceded by a long vowel.
