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Purification

- **W** The **obligatory** *ghusl* is that which is performed for the mentioned three cases or for entering a mosque or reciting the 'aza'im (surahs) if obligatory.
- The ghusl may be deemed obligatory if it remains undone till the dawn of an obligatory fasted day.
 - 4 The *ghusl* is obligatory as well on the menstruating woman, when having *istihadhah* blood soaking the cotton and she has not done the *ghusl* until the dawn of an obligatory fasted day (or for the daily prayer).

The **obligatory** *tayammum* is one performed for obligatory prayers when the person finds **no water or no time** to use it and for the *junub* in one of a two the two mosques (Masjid al-Haram & Masjid an-Nabi) to go out with it.

Taharah may get obligatory through vow (*nazr*) and cases alike.

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- **4** The book of *taharah* is of four parts:
 - 1. (Types of) Waters
 - 2. Taharah with water

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3. Taharah with dust

4. Najasaat

Mutlaq (pure) water is any liquid called water, without any addition (unlike juice for example).

Mutlaq water is tahir (pure) and can be used for (taharah:) removing hadath and khabath.

Regarding occurrence of *najasah* (impurity) in it, the *Mutlaq* water divides into flowing (*Jaari*), *Mahqun* (retained) and well (*Bi'r*) water.

The flowing water does not get *najis* unless through *najasah* prevailing one of its qualities (taste, smell, color).

The impure water can be purified by outpouring abundant water on it until its change is removed.
