Prepositions are *mabni* because they don't need different *i'rab* signs to signify their meanings.

- A. *Sukun* (principally), because it is the lightest sign; such as 'اَضِرِبْ', 'کَمْ'
- # اس a m B. *Fat-h*; such as in 'قامَ", 'أينَ and 'إنَّ and 'إنَّ and 'إنَّ and 'اينَ

- C. *Kasr*; such as 'أمس' and 'جَيرِ'
- D. *Þamm*; such as 'حيث' and 'مُنذُ'

**Note**: Bina' upon *Kasr* or *damm* cannot be found in verbs.
