## Lesson 30 Substitutive *l'rab* Signs in Plural Nouns

Words that get substitutive *i'rab* signs:

- 1. The-six-nouns (الاسماءُ الستّة)
- 2. Dual nouns (مثنّی)
- 3. Regular and masculine plural nouns (الجمع المذكر السالم) which get 'و' for raf' and 'بِ' for nasb and jar

The words capable of being pluralized regularly are derivative (صِفَة) or non-derivative (جامد).

In non-derivatives, the condition is to be masculine proper noun for humans

(unlike 'رينب' and 'لاحق' as a horse's name), free from the 's' of femininity

(unlike طلحة) and combination (unlike طلحة).
