## Lesson 31

### Substitutive *I'rab* Signs in Plural Nouns

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The derivative nouns can be pluralized regularly, provided that:

- They describe masculine intelligent
- They don't end with the 'ة' of femininity
- They must not be on the pattern of "أفعل- فعلاء" or "فعلان- فعلى"
- Their masculine and feminine forms must not be the same

For instance, the following words are excluded:

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- 'حائض' (menstruating); for it is used only for females.
- 'سابق' (when describing a horse); for it is used for a non-intelligent
- 'علامة' (so knowledgeable); for it has the 'ة' of femininity.
- 'أحمر' (red) and (سكران); for their feminine are 'حمراء' and 'سكزى'
- 'صبور' (patient); for its feminine is also 'صبور'

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
