## Lesson 48

## (The Sequence of) Pronouns

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When two pronouns come next to each other and they are attached, the more specific has to come first, but it is optional if they are detached. The first-person pronoun is considered more specific than the second-person pronoun and the third-person pronoun is the least specific. Examples:

instead of 'أعطيتُكَه' instead of 'أعطيتَنيه' 'أعطيتھوکَ' 'أعطيتَھوني'

There is no preference in the detached pronouns: Examples:

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⊕ I m a m S a d i q . t v

'أعطيتُکَ إيّاه'	or	'أعطيتُه إيّاكَ'
'أعطيتَنى إيّاه'	or	'أعطيتَه إيّايَ'

If it leads to confusion or misunderstanding, bringing the less specific pronoun first is not allowed. For instance, saying 'زيد أعطيتك إيّاه' instead of 'زيد أعطيته أيّاکَ' is not allowed, because it would not be clear if 'زيد' is given or taken.

When they are equally specific, one must be detached; 'أعطيتَنينى' instead of 'أعطيتَنى إيّاىَ' اعطيتُكَ ' instead of فاعطيتُكَ ايّاكَ' Im a m S a d i q . t v 'أعطيتهوه' instead of 'أعطيتُه إيّاهُ'

If both are third-person pronouns and their letters are different, they can be both attached; such as 'أعطيتُهماه'.

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
