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## Short Biography

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Father: Musa ibn Ja'far Mother: Najma Khatun (a concubine gifted to Imam al-Kazim<sup>™</sup>) Birthday: 148 A.H. (The year Imam al-Sadiq<sup>™</sup> was martyred) Martyrdom: 203 A.H. Imamate duration: 20 years

### Points regarding the life of Imam al-Rida繩:

  - Their leader: Ali ibn Abi Hamza al-Bataini, Ziyad ibn al-Marwan al-Qandi, and Uthman ibn Isa al-Rawasi

### Reasons for Waqifis' disbelief in Imam al-Rida

1. Financial greed: They did not want to give back the money they had with them as the *wakeels* of Imam al-Kazim<sup>3</sup>.

2. In their perspective, other Imams were too young to become imams.

3. The ghusl service of a *ma'soum* should be done by another *ma'soum*. Imam al-Rida<sup>劉</sup> was in Medina and Imam al-kazim<sup>劉</sup> was martyred in Baghdad.

Imam<sup>®</sup> responded that he went from Medina to Baghdad and buried his father just as Imam Sajjad (as) went from Kufa to Karbala and buried Imam Husain (as)

● I while he was in chains.
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 4. Imam al-Rida<sup><sup>(2)</sup>/<sub>2</sub></sup> did not have any sons then. Imam al-Jawad<sup><sup>(2)</sup>/<sub>2</sub></sub> was born in 195
 A.H., while Imam al-Kazim<sup><sup>(2)</sup>/<sub>2</sub></sub> died in 183.
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• The political circumstances were changing. In his will, Harun appointed his younger son al-Amin (with an Arab mother, Zubaidah) and then al-



Mamun (the oldest with a non-Arab mother) as his successors (Al-Mamun as the crown prince).

- Under the Arab Abbasid's pressure, Harun appointed al-Amin as his successor. It was supposed that al-Amin would give authority to al-Mamun in Khurasan (because his mother was Persian and Persians were loyal to him), but he appointed his son as a crown prince instead of al-
- Mamun. This decision resulted in a civil war, and Al-Mamun came from dig to Khurasan and killed his brother.
  - To suppress the riots after he killed his brother, Mamun decided to bring Imam al-Rida<sup>®</sup> into his government. To:
    - Show people that Ahlulbayt are not that perfect, and if any oppression occurs, their hands will be dirty as well
    - Convince that Ahlulbayt won't be considered oppressed anymore
    - Quiet all the rebellions down.
  - Imam al-Rida<sup>®</sup> did not accept Mamun's offer until he threatened the life of Imam and forced him to leave Medina.
- Mamun ordered to bring Imam<sup>®</sup> with an entourage. Generals and soldiers came to take Imam<sup>®</sup> from Medina to Khurasan. He drew the map of the path for his generals not to bring Imam<sup>®</sup> from Shia cities like Kufa because he was afraid of rebels.
  - In Neyshabur (a city about 100 km from Mashhad), when people asked him for a hadith, Imam al-Rida<sup>(2)</sup>, delivered the golden-chain hadith (الذهب الذهب): quoting from his father Imam al-Kazim<sup>(2)</sup>, who quoted from his father Imam al-Baqir<sup>(2)</sup> and... from Rasulullah<sup>(2)</sup> from Gabriel from Allah (SWT):

«كلمة لاإله إلّا الله حِصني؛ فمَن دَخَلَ حصني أمِنَ مِن عذابي»

Saying the word "There is no God but Allah" is my sanctuary and fort; whoever enters my fort will be saved from my punishment." Imam added one more thing:

و لكن بِشَرطِها و شُروطِها و أنا مِن شروطها». «و لكن بِشَرطِها و شُروطِها و أنا مِن شروطها» "However, it has conditions and I am one of the conditions."

- New coins with the name of Imam al-Rida<sup>®</sup> were made.
- Al-Mamun brought scholars from different religions with different languages to debate with Imam al-Rida



• Eventually, Al-Ma'mun became extremely jealous of the Imam<sup>2</sup> and poisoned him. Then the Imam<sup>2</sup> was buried next to Harun.

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
