The command and past verbs are mabni

And muḍari' is considered mu'rab if it is free ...

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من نون توكيد مباشر و من

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نون اناث كـ «يُرْعَنَ مَن فُتِنَ»

From the directly-attached emphasis 'noon' and

femininity 'noon' as in 'يُرْعَنَ'

The *mabni* verbs:

ImamSadiq.tv 1. Unanimously accepted as *mabni*: Past tense verbs; e.g. 'ضَرَبَ' ImamSadiq.tv

2. Conflictual acceptance as *mabni*: Command verbs; e.g. 'اضْرِبْ' ImamSadiq.tv



Among the *muḍari'* verbs, five of them are directly connected to 'noon' of emphasis and therefore are *mabni*: *seeghah* 1, 4, 7, 13 & 14 and the two plural feminine verbs (6 and 12) are also already *mabni*.

Muḍari' gets *mabni* when emphasis 'noon' is attached to it, unless there is something between the third root letter and the 'noon':

- A. 'ا' in the duals
- B. 'و' in the masculine plurals
- C. 'ی' in the second person feminine
