Purity of Non-Muslims

- \clubsuit A pot of grape juice becomes Haram immediately upon getting boiled and it can be purified if $2/3^{rd}$ of the juice evaporates.
- ♣ After the evaporation of 2/3rd juice, it becomes purified and its consumption becomes *Halal*, and along with its purification, the pot and spoon also get purified.

Impurities

9. Fuqqa

Fuqqa is any wine or beer made from barley. It is Najis and its consumption is a star Haram.

10. The sweat of a Junub from haram.

- **↓** Junub or Mujnib is a person who is in the state of Janabah.
- ♣ If a person enters the state of *Janabah* due to a Haram act, according to some scholars, his sweat is Najis.

11. Kafir

- ♣ The non-Muslims who are pagans, idol-worshippers and atheists are Najis as per the consensus of the scholars, but there is a disagreement over the impurity of those non-Muslims who are Ahl al-Kitab (people of the book).
 - ♣ The Imam (as) was asked about eating along with Jews and Christians. The Imam (as) said: There is no problem if the food is prepared by you. (Tahdhib al-Ahkam, vol. 9, pg. 88)



Types of Najasah (impurity):

Najasah Dhatiyya: Essential/Inherent Impurity – like blood, dog, pig etc.
Najasah Aradhiyya: Accidental/External Impurity – A bottle of water that became *Najis* due to a drop of blood.

The people of the book (like Christians and Jews) are not inherently impure.

Their impurity is accidental/external in nature.
