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Ghusl al-Janabah

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Six Obligatory Ghusls

- 1. Ghusl al-Janabah
- 2. Ghusl al-Haydh
- 3. Ghusl al-Istihadhah
- 4. Ghusl al-Nifas
- 5. Ghusl al-Mayyit
- 6. Ghusl Mass al-Mayyit
- Imam Sadiq (as) said: Ghusl al-Janabah is mandatory.
 (Wasa'il al-Shia, v. 3, p. 303)

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Imam Sadiq (as) said: He who doesn't wash even a single hair from Janabah deliberately, will end up in hell.
 (Wasa'il al-Shia, v. 2, p. 173)

Three ways of becoming Junub:

- 1. Sexual Intercourse, with or without discharge of semen.
- 2. Ejaculation or the discharge of semen (for men).
- 3. Excessive discharge by women.

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If someone saw a passionate dream and upon waking up, found no trace of discharge, he will consider himself pure. However, if he saw traces of discharge, he must perform Ghusl of Janabah.

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- It is highly recommended for a male to urinate before performing Ghusl al-Janabah because if he does not urinate, then any doubtful discharge after the Ghusl will be considered semen and he will have to perform the Ghusl again.
- If you're sharing clothes with someone and you find traces of Janabah on them, but you don't know if it was from you or the other person, you will apply the Law of Continuity (استصحاب) and consider yourself pure.
 - The Imam (as) was asked if it is correct for someone to sleep in the state of Janabah? He said: It is better to do Wudhu before sleeping and it is best to perform the Ghusl before it.

It is highly unrecommended for a person to sleep in Janabah without Wudhu.

- If someone is in the state of Janabah in the month of Ramadan at night, and he deliberately sleeps till Fajr without caring to perform Ghusl al-Janabah, his fasting that day will be invalid.
- If someone slept accidently or with the plan of waking up before Fajr to S a d i q t v perform Ghusl but he couldn't, then in such case, his fasting is valid but he must do Ghusl as soon as he wakes up.
 - This rule applies only to the fasting of the month of Ramadan. Remaining in the state of Janabah till Fajr will not invalidate the Mustahab fasting or the fasting that becomes obligatory due to vows, etc.

Acts prohibited in the state of Janabah:

- 1. To recite any verse from the 4 chapters of obligatory Sajdah (Fussilat, Najm, Sajdah and Alaq) or specifically the 4 verses of Sajdah.
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Acts prohibited in the state of Janabah:

2. To touch the name of Allah.



3. To stay in a Mosque; unless he wants to pass from one door to another. This rule applies to a Masjid; not to prayer rooms or prayer halls that are not a part of a Mosque. The same law applies to the holy shrines of Masoomeen (as).

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
