Topic: Apparent and Unapparent Tasawwur and Tasdeeq

- Knowledge is perception of things and is either apprehension or affirmation.
- Sometimes affirmation is the ascription of the lack of something for something else.
- Kinds of Tasawwur and Tasdeeq

Section 4

Apprehension (Tasawwur) is of two kinds:

- Apparent (Badeehi); like the concept of fire
- Cognitive (*nazari*); which needs contemplation for comprehension.

Likewise, Affirmation is of two kinds:

- Apparent; like the concept of "fire is hot"
- Cognitive; which needs contemplation, like that God is the creator

How to Attain Cognitive Apprehension and Affirmation:

The method is to arrange the apparent apprehensions in a manner which leads to cognitive (nazari) apprehension and arrange apparent affirmations to lead to cognitive (nazari) affirmation.

- ✓ Al-Mu'arrif (definien): Those apparent apprehensions by which one attains the cognitive apprehension
- ✓ Al-Hujjah (evidence): Those apparent affirmations by which one attains the cognitive affirmation

The Aim in Logic

The aim in logic is to recognize *mu'arrif* and *hujjah* in order to attain the unknown (cognitive) apprehension and affirmation.
