

# Mufrad and Murakkab / Taamm and Naaqis





## 1) *Taamm* (complete)

When the expression is complete and does not need any addition; e.g. Ali is here.

### *Tamm* is divided to:


- 1) *Khabar* (informative); which can be true or false; e.g. Ali came.
- 2) *Inshaa'* (creative): which is not true or false; e.g. come here.






### Inshaa' is either:

- Frankly; such as the command verb, prohibitive command verb and interrogative
- Not frankly; such as wishing, hoping, surprise or calling.



- 2) *Naqis* (defective) is either:
- Murakkab Taqyeedi (bound compound)
- Ghair Taqyeedi (unbound compound)



## - Murakkab Taqyeedi (bound compound):

A word which has two parts and the second is bound to the first and the intention is not understood from the first without the second; e.g. <u>house</u> of <u>Ali</u> or <u>Ali</u> who is knowledgeable

## - *Ghair Taqyeedi* (unbound compound)

In which the intention from the first part's meaning is understood with or without the second; e.g. خمسة (15) in which غشرة (15) is known without عشرة
