- * Types of Attributive Propositions (القضايا الحملية)
- A. Intellectual attributive (zihniyyah) proposition → when the subject exists in the mind only; e.g. combination of two opposites is impossible.
- B. External attributive (Kharijiyyah) proposition → when the subject exists in reality only; e.g. every house you see in the town is built by Ali.
- C. Literal (haqeeqiyyah) proposition → when the determination is for every existing and non-existing member of the subject; e.g. every human is disposed to knowledge.

Section 29

- ✓ **Muhassalah**: a *qadiyyah* in which no negative word is a part of *maudoo'* or *mahmul*; e.g. "Ali is standing" or "Ali is not standing".
- ✓ **Ma'dulah**(obverted): A *qadiyyah* in which a negative word is a part of:
 - Maudoo'(subject-obverted)
 - Mahmul (attribute-obverted)
 - Both (two sides-obverted)
