AL-MUWAJJAHAAT (DIRECTED ATTRIBUTES)

Mutlaqah and Muwajjahah (absolute and directed)

✓ If the attributive proposition does not make the perspective clear on the relationship between the attribute and the subject, it is called: *Mutlaqah* (absolute).

Muwajjahah

✓ If the perspective of the relation (between the attribute and the subject) is clarified, the *qadiyyah* is called *Muwajjahah* (directed).



Types of muwajjahah:

1) Absolute imperative (الضرورية المُطلقة): as long as the reality of the subject exists, the attribute is a necessity for it; e.g. every human has senses.

2) Absolute condition (المشروطة العامّة): as long as the description exists for the subject, the attribute is a necessity; e.g. every writer human moves the fingers.

3) Absolute temporal (الوقتية المطلقة): the attribute is a necessity for a specific time. E.g. every human is red-faced in anger.

4) **Absolute extended (المنتشرة المطلقة)**. The attribute is a necessity in an unspecified time; e.g. every human is breathing at whatever time.
