## Lesson 10

## • ImamSadiq tPast or Perfect Tense + Conjugation ImamSadiq tv

- 1. The perfect tense is one of the two simple forms of the verb in Arabic and basically narrative in function. In most cases, it denotes a completed event or action.
- 2. The Arabic perfect tense corresponds to both the English past tense and present perfect:

كَتَبَ: He wrote. He has written. ذَهَب: He went. He has gone. # I m a m S a d i g . t v # I m a m S a d i g . t v

# Im a m S a diq.tv # Im a m S a diq.tv # Im a m S a diq.tv A) The vowel a (Fatha) invariably follows  $R_1$  and  $R_3$  in the perfect tense.

- B)  $R_2$  is mostly followed by a (Fatha): گَتَبَ (to write), ذَهَبَ (to go), فَعَلَ (to do), often by i (Kasra): شَرِبَ (to drink),
- C) سَمِعَ (sth was good), حَسُنَ (sth was good), حَسُنَ (sth became big).

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
