*Idghaam* is also obligatory in *seeghah* 7-12 of the command verb.

أَمُرُّ ← أَمْزُرُ  
إِيسِرُّ ← إِيسِرُّ

In the remaining *seeghah*, the reduction of the *Hamzah* is permissible.

يَأْمُرُ ← يَأْمُرُ  
يُؤْمَرُ ← يَوْمَرُ  
لِيُؤْمَرَ ← لِيَوْمَرَ

There are common exceptions to the patterns set forth above, particularly in:

'أَمَرَ', 'أَكَلَ', 'أَخَذَ', (obligatory in the first two)

أَوْخَذُ ← خُذْ  
أَوْكُلْ ← كُنْ  
أَوْمَرُ ← مَرُّ

Another exception is in 'سَأَلَ'. (permissible)

سَأَلَ ← سَأَلَ  
يَسْأَلُ ← يَسْأَلُ  
إِسْأَلَ ← سَأَلَ

In the *seeghah* 1, 4,6,7,12,14 of the active voice command verb the *Alif* will be elided due to the presence of two *saakin* letters.

لَيْسَأَلُ ← لَيْسَأَلُ  
لِأَسَأَلَ ← لِأَسَأَلَ

In the 9<sup>th</sup> and the 10<sup>th</sup> you can also find: سَلُوا، سَلِي.
