I'laal in Ajwaf in the Past Tense Passive Voice Verb

Here, the rule of *l'laal Sukooni* is that the vowel on the weak letter is transferred to the preceding letter and the weak letter transforms to *Yaa'*.

From the 6th seeghah onward, the first saakin letter is elided:

I'laal in the Present Tense Active Voice Verb

The vowel of the weak letter is shifted to the preceding letter and the weak letter must transform to the long vowel that complements the vowel on the preceding letter.

In the 6th and the 12th seeghah, the first saakin letter is elided.

I'laal in the Present Tense Passive Voice Verb

Based on the pattern 'يُفعَل', the procedure is:

And in the 6th and 12th:

I'laal in the Command Verb

In the 1st, 4th, 13th and 14th seeghah, due to the rule of *l'laal Hazhfi*, the weak letter is elided.

In the 7th seeghah the procedure is:
