We can divide knowledge into two divisions: **Axiomatic Knowledge (الع**لم الضرورى) and **Reflective Knowledge (ال**علم النظرى). The knowledge of some affairs, such as existence, can be obtained without reflection or thought. All that is needed is for a person to turn his soul towards something. This is known as **necessary or axiomatic knowledge**.

It is not necessary that every person must be aware of all the axioms; if a person is ignorant of an axiom, that does not mean it is not axiomatic.

The causes (أسباب) which allow one to understand axioms:

• Attention

• Healthy mind

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- Healthy senses
- Lack of confusion
- Non-intellective (ghayr `aqliyyah) operations

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
