The non-derivative noun can be pluralized in the following conditions:

- 1. Proper noun
- 2. For male
- 3. Intelligent Masculine
- 4. Should not end with the 'ة' of femininity.
- 5. Should not be a compound noun (*tarkeeb*)

The derivative nouns can be pluralized regularly, provided that:

- 1. They describe a male
- 2. They are used for intelligent masculine
- 3. They don't end with the ' \ddot{o} ' of femininity
- 4. They must not be on the pattern of "أفعل- فَعلاء"
- They must not be on the pattern of "فَعلان- فَعلَى"
- 6. Their masculine and feminine forms must not be the same, like "صبور"

The attachments of masculine regular plural noun (in *i'rab*):

- 'and the like (they do not have singular forms)
- أولوا' (does not have a singular form)



- 'أهلون' (which is non-derivative but not a proper noun) 'أ
- (which is non-derivative but not a proper noun) 'عالَمون'
- عِلَّيُون' (which is not a name for an intelligent thing)
- مسنون' , 'أرّضون' and the like (which are non-derivative, their singulars 'سِنون' ،

are feminine and not proper nouns)
