Lesson 14

The Clothing for Salat

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Salat is invalid in any the fur, the hair, etc., of haram-meat animals, even if taken (clipped) of a legally slaughtered (*mudhakka*), except in pure *khazz*.

1. *Salat* is valid in the fur of squirrels (*sinjab*), since it does not eat meat. Some other legists observe that it is impermissible. The first opinion is more probable as per the verdicts (of legists).

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In regard to the hair of **foxes and rabbits**, there are two views, the most correct of which is **prohibition**.

 It is not permissible for men to wear pure silk or pray in it except in time of war, and in emergency cases, like the coldness preventing from taking it off. However, it is absolutely permissible for women.

In regard to pure silk in the things with which the salat can never be performed singly - such as a waistband or a cap - there is disagreement (among legists), and being *makruh* is more preponderant.



Salat is valid in a clothing embroidered with silk. If it is mixed with something permissible for *salat* in a way it can't be called pure silk, it can be worn outside and during the *salat*, whether its proportion is more than the silk or less than that.

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
