Lesson 28

Acts of Salah/Qira'ah

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- 1. Niyyah
- 2. Takbirat al-Ihram
- 3. Qiyam

Points:

- Reciting a complete surah after *al-Hamd* in the first two *rak'ah*s is *wajib*in the daily obligatory prayers.
- It is neither permissible to recite any of the *Surahs* of '*Aza'im* (the four *surahs* in which there is a *wajib sujud*), nor a surah the recitation of which causes missing the time of the *salah*, nor to join between two *surahs* (Some say it is *makruh*, which is preponderant.).
- It is wajib (on men) to recite the two surahs (not the other recitations) aloud (美) in the fajr prayer, and the first two rak'ahs of maghrib and 'isha prayers.
- The *qira'ah* in the *zuhr* and 'asr prayers is to be done -except for the basmalah- in a low voice in their first two rak'ahs, and also in the third rak'ah of maghrib and the last two rak'ahs of 'isha prayers.

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- **The minimum level of voice** considered loud is that a person nearby be able to hear it, and the minimum for low voice is that the person himself be able to hear it. Reciting aloud is not prescribed for women.
- → The masnun (sunnah) in this regard is to recite the basmalah aloud in the

 - ↓ ... and to recite them in a *tartil* (expressing the letters and words clearly)
 way, and to follow the punctuation marks (locations of *waqf*).
 - Reciting another surah after *al-Hamd* in the supererogatory prayers is a *sunnah*.

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
